David Bokovoy is currently an instructor in the Seminaries and Institutes of Religion for the Church Education System. Bokovoy taught institute classes in the Boston area for the past six years at Harvard, MIT, and Wellesley College. He is a PhD candidate in Hebrew Bible and the Ancient Near East at Brandeis University, preparing to defend his dissertation (January 2011) exploring the topic of God's sexual nature in the Yahwistic source's primordial history. Much of his research explores the nature and function

of the divine council of deities in biblical and in the general ancient Near Eastern tradition. He has published on this subject most recently in " 'Hear, and testify against the house of Jacob': Invoking the Council as Witnesses in Amos 3:13," *Journal of Biblical Literature* 127.1 (2008). A former LDS Chaplain at Harvard University, he received an MA in Near Eastern and Judaic studies from Brandeis University. Bokovoy is married to the former Carolyn Bird, and they are the parents of four children.
